

Memorandum. That on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year  
1827 Abijah Tyles of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky  
being sick of the sickness whereof he died, on the same day  
swelling house in said County did make and declare his last  
and nuncupative in these or words of like substance, That is to  
say give and bequeath unto my wife Polly One negro girl named  
Liddy or Lydia and to my nephews Harry Tyles and  
John Tyles who now live with mother hundreds of dollars each and  
a horse each and good schooling, these words or to the like effect  
the said Abijah Tyles declared in the presence of the sub-  
scribers with the intention that the same should be his last will  
and testament, which we reduced to writing this 10 day of  
Sept 1827

scribers with the intention that the same should be his last will  
and testament, which was reduced to writing this 16 day of  
Sept 1827
