

In the name of God Amen.

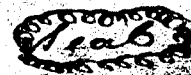
I Agniss Mearns of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky, being at this time sick, but of sound and disposing mind and memory and wishing to settle all my worldly affairs do make this my last will and testament in manner following To wit. I will that my body be decently buried and my funeral charges be paid in the first place out of my estate. Item, I give and bequeath to my son Andrew Mearns my negro man Jones to him and his heirs forever. Item. I will that my negro woman Molly be free at my decease. And as for the rest of my estate real and personal I give and bequeath to be equally divided between my children Viz. John, Alexander, Nathan, Mary Mcleaster, Elizabeth Ross, Nancy Taylor and my son Allen Mearns. It is my will and desire that my daughters Rachel Mearns and Sarah Shirley be each of them allowed sixty dollars out of my estate more than an equal proportion, they having not been so fully provided for by the last will and testament of deceased husband John Mearns. It is my will and desire that the negro man Jones by this will named to my son Andrew, with that part of the household furniture heretofore named to him is all that he is to have out of my estate. and lastly I do constitute and appoint my son Andrew Mearns Executor of this my last will and testament, revoking and making null and void all other wills by me heretofore made Signed, Sealed, published and pronounced to be my last will and testament in presence of us this 13th day of Sept 1832
