 7th To my daughter Abigail Hunter Tabbs and one negro boy
 named Isaac, One negro girl named Nanny, One mare
 with saddle and bridle now in her possession, One bed
 furniture, Six silver tea spoons and sugar tongs, one looking glass
 that hangs in the front room in my house.

8th To my son Philip I give and bequeath one negro boy named
 Sam, one other named John, one other named Manuel, one girl
 named Nancy one bed and furniture, mare, saddle and bridle
 9th I wish my son Charles to settle and pay my just debts
 to attend to raising and educating my son Philip and like
 wise my daughter Abigail to live with him while she remains
 single if she chooses so to do and to enable him so to do I give
 him one negro man called Sam, One negro woman called
 Nancy, One negro woman called Penny, One negro boy named
 Hackey, two beds and furniture together with all my house
 hold furniture and kitchen and farming utensils at my
 decease together with my stock, horses and cows and sheep
 and hogs and grain of all kinds, with whatever also is on
 it for the use of said plantation and stock.

10th It is my will that if my son Phillip should die while a
 minor his property shall be equally divided as near may be be
 tween Charles and Abigail and without selling his negroes.
 It is farther my will that at the age of sixteen my son Phillip
 be bound to learn one of the following trades viz. a house joiner
 brick layer or plasterer which he may choose.

brick layer or plasterer or any other trades or to make for me
10th I do make, ordain, constitute and appoint my son Charles Smoot
my whole and sole Executor and request him to do and fulfill
every item and article contained in this my last will and testa-
ment, thereby revoking, disannulling and making void all and
every other will or wills or Testaments by me made whatsoever and
ratifying this to be and confirming the same as my last will
or testament this twentieth day of September One thousand eight
hundred and twenty ^{two}

5 In the name of God Amen I Alexander Smeat of Jefferson
County and State of Kentucky farmer, being in perfect mind
and memory And calling to mind that it is appointed for all
men once to die do make and ordain this to be my last will
and testament Viz

First of all I give and resign my Soul to God my maker from
whom I did receive it and my body I recommend to the earth
to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner at the
discretion of my Executors hereinafter named. And as for the
 worldly property wherewith the Lord has blessed me with, I
 give and bequeath in manner and form following.

1st The plantation on which I live I wish to be equally divided
between my sons Alexander and Charles in such manner as
to give to Charles the part next the Big road leading to Salt
River, to include the houses in which I now live and the Orchard
2nd To my son George I give and bequeath one dollar
3rd To my son Alexander I give and bequeath one negro boy
I am at now in his possession.

4th I give to my daughter Sarah the one negro boy
Bill which has been in her possession and her husband's.

I give to my step daughter Sarah the bed, bedding
furniture now in her possession, also one cow, a horse a saddle
and bridle

I give to my son Walter P. Frederick one negro girl named
and her increase and to my son John P. Frederick a negro boy named
Stem. I give to my son Augustus Frederick the sum of three hundred
and eighty three dollars and 78 cents which sum I advance to him
at three different times as will be found by his notes given to me
and which notes shall be given to him after my decease, which sum
together with the interest due thereon, together with horse, saddle and
bridle, value of one hundred dollars I gave to him shall be his full
share out of my estate

Item. It is my will that my beloved wife Polly shall remain on my
plantation where we now reside and shall receive all the rents
profits and emoluments of the same for her maintenance and
the education of my two children Walter and John P. Frederick
And it is my will that all the stock, horses, cattle, sheep, hogs,
owing interests of what kind and nature soever shall belong
to her for the use and cultivation of the farm. And all the
negroes who are not particularly bequeathed in this will
shall also remain. And after her death the negroes shall be
equally divided amongst my said two sons. But in case my
said wife should marry again, then she will take her
share of my estate according to the law of this State. And if any
my last mentioned children should die the survivors of them
shall be the lawful heirs of its deceased part and no others. But

is never to be my will that after my decease there shall
not a sufficient sum of money be found to discharge the several
legacies herein bequeathed and which shall be paid to the in-
speers herein mentioned as soon as possible, that in such a
my Executors shall dispose so much of my personal estate
shall be sufficient to discharge the several bequests herein directed
to be paid. It is further my will and I do hereby give and
devise to my two sons Walter P. & Frederick and John P. & O.
rick and to their heirs and assigns the following tracts of
lands, To Wit, Two hundred and Sixty Six acres which I bought
of Alexander Breckinridge, Ninety acres which I bought of
Robt Breckinridge and adjoining the same and 91 acres
which I bought of the heirs of Thomas Lammert, containing
in the whole four hundred and forty six acres, to have
and to hold the said tracts of land for themselves and their
heirs and assigns forever. And lastly I nominate and ap-
point my trusty friends James Bacon and my son Samuel
Bacon my Executors of this my last will and testament
revoking all former wills by me made and declaring this
to be my last will and testament. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5
day of January 1826
