

In the name of God Amen, I Alice Jones of Jefferson County and  
State of Kentucky being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory  
thanks be to God and knowing that it is once appointed for all persons to  
die and knowing the uncertainty of life, that when it should please  
God to take me out of this world, I resign my soul to God who gave it  
and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner as  
my Executor hereafter mentioned shall think most convenient, and  
all my worldly estate after my just debts and funeral expenses are  
discharged I do dispose of as hereafter mentioned. First- I give  
and bequeath unto my loving son John Jones one negro man named  
George to him and his heirs forever, also one negro man named Charles  
during his natural life and at his decease to my daughter Anne Washell  
Jones and at her decease it is my desire she should have his freedom.  
Secondly- I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my loving son John  
Jones one negro woman named Hannah and her increase to them  
and their heirs forever. Thirdly- I give and bequeath unto my Grand  
son William Scarborough Jones one negro boy named James to him  
and his heirs forever. Fourthly- I give and bequeath unto my Grand son  
David Ward Jones one negro girl named Meria to him and his heirs  
forever. Fifthly- I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Anne  
Washell Jones, the negro woman named Ester, one named Samar, one  
named Selia, one named Harriet and one negro boy named Hamilton  
to her and her heirs forever. Sixthly- I give and bequeath unto my loving  
daughter Eleanor Smith Jones the following negro girls to wit- Fanny,  
Florah, Polly and Milly to her and heirs forever. Seventhly- I give and  
bequeath unto my two living daughters, Anne Washell Jones and Eleanor

bequeath unto my two living daughters, Anne Washiell Jones and  
Smith Jones one Negro man named Nod to them as long as they both live,  
And it is my desire that he shall be the property of the longest liver to  
her and her heirs forever. It is also my desire that each of them shall have  
a horse, bridle and saddle of equal value to the one I now own to them  
and their heirs forever. Eighthly, I give and bequeath to my loving son  
John Jones the sum of fifty dollars to be paid out of my estate as a com-  
pensation for what he has done towards making my crop to him and  
his heirs forever. Ninthly and lastly, All the residue of my property of what  
soever kind it may be I give and bequeath unto my two daughters Anne  
Washiell Jones and Eleanor Smith Jones to be equally divided between  
them. It is also my will and desire that my son John Jones should be  
my sole Executor of this my last Will and testament. In Witness where-  
of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighth day of July  
in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twelve.
