

In the name of God Amen. I Andreas Lavitt being of lawful
age and sound mind and knowing the shortness of life and
certainly of death do make this my last will and testament
in the following manner Viz. My soul I desire should return
to God to dwell with him forever and my body I desire after my
death should be taken to Middleton Kentucky and buried be-
side my two children deceased in a Christian manner and
there to remain until the morning of the Resurrection for
which I look through Jesus Christ in whom I trust for im-
mortality and eternal life
It is furthermore my will that all my just debts including
funeral expenses yet should be paid out of such monies as
may be on hand or collected on any notes, leases, bonds or ac-
counts due or coming due at my decease. I wish also my in-
strument in the Cabinet Shop on Market Street and the tools
to be sold and the money to be appropriated if need be, to
the payment of my debts. I give my Lepine watch to my brother
in law Ellridge H. Morrow. After my debts are all paid, I
desire that the proceeds of rents and other money should be
appropriated to the education of my daughter Mary Anne
Elizabeth at a private boarding school until she shall be
fourteen years of age and any balance afterwards to be for the
benefit of my said daughter. At the age of fifteen I wish her to
have the sole possession and management of whatever may remain
of my estate. I also give unto my beloved daughter my large
lot of land lying between the river and the road leading to the

benefit of my said daughter, I do hereby give and bequeath to her to have the sole possession and enjoyment of whatever may remain of my estate. I also give unto my beloved daughter my large family bible. If my daughter Mary Ann Elizabeth should die at any time before marriage, then in that case I give all my estate as above mentioned to Lucinda Morrow my sister in law. And I do hereby appoint William F. Morrow Executor of this my last will and testament.
