Be it known that I Andrew Black of sound mind and understanding do make this my last will and testament. I will and bequeath to Richard Taylor of Jefferson County all my stock of Horses consisting of One Bay mare and One grey Colt to be disposed of amongst his Family as he shall think fit or proper. Item I will and bequeath all my stock of cattle and the said Richard Taylor of Jefferson County One Cow and half and huffer and two Steers to be disposed of above mentioned, I will and bequeath my feather Bed and Furniture to the said Richard Taylor to be disposed of by him on his Family as he shall think proper. Item I will and bequeath all my Out standing debts of what kind so ever to the aforesaid Richard Taylor to be by him disposed of in his Family as he shall think fit or proper. In Confirmation whereof I have set my hand and seal this second day of Aug 1797.
