Just Lecog Mumarcellay and Denise Lecog Mumarcellay (and at her
death I devise and bequeath the same to my said two children
to them and their heirs forever and it is my will and desire
and I do hereby authorize and empower said wife to sell or other-
wise dispose of the whole or any part of my said estate in such
manner as she may deem best calculated to promote her comfort
and happiness and the interest of my said children.
Thirdly. It is my will and desire and I do hereby direct
that my Executrix and Executor (herein after named) shall not
be required by the Court when they shall qualify as such to give
bond with security as the law directs, nor shall any inventory
or appraisement of my personal estate be made or any sale thereof
be made unless my said Executrix or Executor shall either find
expedient to do so.

Lastly, I nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Theresa and my son Just Lecog Dumarsellay Executrix and Executor of this my last will and testament
