First I leave my wife Charity one negro girl Fenny during
life time, or if she should think it best, she shall have the
right to sell her and dispose of the money as she may think best.
Also one hundred dollars to her as it is collected on bonds
due me; but should she not sell the negro girl during her
life time, after her death she is to be sold and the money
equally divided amongst all my children, except George, for
he is to have no more, but one dollar, as I believe he has
his full proportional part of my estate.

Secondly, I bequeath unto my four daughters Mary Webb,
Peggy Beck, Susan Shaffer and Polly Goben all the notes and
bills against Henry Dean and Charity Fenny late
Charity Glouven to be equally divided amongst the above
named four daughters, after Peggy Beck, Susan Shaffer
and Polly Goben first drawing seventy five dollars
each to make them equal with Mary Webb, money paid
her. And all the balance of my property to equally divi-
ded amongst all my children, notes, bonds and every-
thing I possess, except as above excepted my son George.
And he is to have no more. And after said division
made, each one shall have full power to collect his
part of the notes and bonds.

of writing, purporting to be the last will and testament

and testament of said Andrew Frederick deceased, And

of every kind and my stock of hogs (except one) and all other stock and also all my negroes. I have the following terms and conditions: All my children except Samuel Mary Ann, John Lanning, Elizabeth, Martha and Levi are to live with me and be educated in the same manner as though they were my own children of age or marry. She is also to educate the youngest of my said children in proper manner and pay the expenses without charge to any of them. And as they shall come off in the same manner that my first daughter came off in the same manner when they were married to wit: negroes in value to fifteen dollars and fifty cents, four cows and calves, six pigs and lambs, three hens and two turkeys and furniture for each. And in case she shall die before my said first or any child or any of them are or shall be married for as above, then the said child is to die with the child to be appointed as they are at age or marry as if they were the remaining negroes being given to any state, that they are out by any executor having married, or the surviving spouse and the usual way of hiring negroes until my youngest child shall come of age or marry and the expenses thereof. I have to pay the expenses of such of my children as shall be married and educating of such of my children as shall be unmarried and the care

about the persons who shall be charged with the expenses of
boarding, cloathing, supporting and educating of such of my
children as might be unmarried or unmarried, and the same
thereof to be equally divided between all my children or their
heirs. And when my youngest child shall arrive at full age
or marry then it is my will and desire and I do hereby direct
a division of the negroes then belonging to my estate and not
hereto otherwise disposed of shall take place in the way and
manner herein after directed, between all of my children then
living, share and share alike. And in case any of them shall
die, their share shall go to his, her or their child or children
if there be any, if not then to such of my children or their
children as shall be living.

Item. It is my will and desire and I do hereby direct that
in case any of my negroes shall behave improperly or in any
manner that my said wife may consider it unsafe and
the interest of my estate to hold them longer, that my
or the survivors of them shall sell such negro or negroes
best price that can be had. And if my estate shall at any
time be in debt, the proceeds thereof shall be applied to
the discharge of such debt or debts, if not for debt, then
the same shall be held in other negroes and held in
manner as my said wife may see fit. And I am of the opinion
said wife and she shall keep the same as long as she shall
or rather as the same may be sold as above directed.
