Jun^r of Jefferson County, State of Virginia being very low in Body
but in my proper senses doth this sixteenth day of August 1784
make and publish this my last Will and Testament, and first of
principally I recommend my Soul to God who gave it, and my
Body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like Manner, and
to such worldly Estate as the Lord hath blessed me with I give and
dispose of in the following Manner. Viz^t. and first it is my Will
and I order, that all my just Debts be paid, and secondly I give
bequeath unto my Honored Father Andrew Vaughan all the sum
of my Estate both real & personal and also appoint him my
Executor to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness Whereof
I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal in the presence of the
Witnesses the Day and Year above written.
