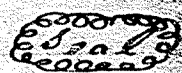


Sam

And after her death I will and devise the said house and lot and the said tract of land by equal parts to Margaret Garay and Rebecca Smith and their heirs and assigns forever.

Next. I constitute my said wife Sole Executrix of my last will testament and I do hereby revoke and cancel all wills which I may have heretofore made and declare this to be my true last will and testament.
