

Examin'd I Betty Coleman of the County of Jefferson and State of Ken-
tucky do make this my last will and testament in manner follow-
ing To wit: I give and bequeath to my Grand son William L. Thomp-
son upon trust and for the use of my Grand daughter Melinda
Oliver and her heirs as negro named Charles the son of Charles
and Billa, also a negro named Sally daughter of the said
Charles and Billa. To my Grand son Phillip Reels Thompson I
give and bequeath my negro Bingley the son of Leato to him and
his heirs. I give and bequeath to my Grand son Robert Coleman
Thompson and to his heirs my negro Mortimer the son of the said
Leato. I also give and bequeath to my Grand son William L.
Thompson upon trust and to the use of my Grand daughter
Melinda Oliver Thompson and her heirs my negro Lucy Ann the
daughter of Diley. To my Grandson Francis Thornton Thomp-

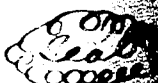
deem best to include the graves thereon, which shall not be sold or transferred with the residue of the lands; but be reserved in my children as a family Burial Ground.

All the rest and residue of my land as well as personal property of every description (my negroes excepted as aforesaid) shall be sold by my Executors and the land conveyed by them within a reasonable time after my death and the money arising from such sales, shall go to be distributed among my Grand children and their representatives in the same manner as if I had died intestate. So much of the property and money hereby bequeathed and intended to be divided among my Grand children as well those who are now married as those who are now single and may hereafter marry.

I give to my Grand son William Lightfoot Thompson upon trust and to the use and purposes following and no other I will, That the said William L. Thompson shall hold the same subject to the use and benefit of my Grand daughters and their heirs to the exclusion of the control or management of any other person whatever.

I hereby appoint my friend John Peay and my Grandson William Lightfoot Thompson Executors of my will, and if either of them shall die or refuse to act, then I give to the other all the powers hereby given to them jointly.
