niture together with my table & chairs &
Item the 3rd It is my desire that my Executors within six months
after my death shall liberate my woman Philis and do or
order the same to be done.

Item the 4th I give to Williams Withers my rifle, my shot
gun to J Chadburn, my musket to J Withers. Whereunto I
have set my hand and seal in the year of our Lord one
of June One thousand eight hundred and thirty.

At a County Court held for Jefferson
County at the Court house in the City of Louisville on the
Sixth day of September eighteen hundred and thirty.
The foregoing instrument of writing purporting to be
the last will and testament of Charles Withers deceased
was produced in Court and proved to be such by the oath
of Thomas Brown, two of the subscribing witnesses thereto
and established by the Court as the last will and testament
of the said Charles Withers and ordered to be recorded.
And on the motion of John Chadburn One of the Executors
named in the said will (John Withers the other Executor
named in said will having renounced Execution thereof)
who made oath according to law, Execution of the said
will is granted the said John Chadburn, Whereupon he
gave bond in the penalty of Eight hundred dollars with
John Rouse his security conditioned according to law
