I Christopher McColloch of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being of sound mind do make this my last Will and Testament in the words following—
First— I will and bequeath my land and negro man called Stephen and all other species of property belonging to me (to my Executors) to be by them sold for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

Item— I give and bequeath to my wife one third part of the interest of the money arising from the sale of my Estate for her annual support during her life.

Item. I give and bequeath to my three children Daniel McColloch, Rachel McColloch; and Alexander McColloch, the residue of the money arising from the sale of my Estate to be equally divided among them as they arrive of age, each to take his share with the exception hereinafter mentioned.

Item— And whereas the Grand father of my son Daniel and daughter Rachel McColloch hath given to Daniel a tract of land in Hardin County and State of Kentucky and unto my daughter Rachel McColloch an interest in a tract of land in the State of Pennsylvania and hath given nothing to my son Alexander McColloch for which reason it is my will and desire, that if my son Daniel and daughter Rachel should obtain the lands so given or the greater part thereof (by their Grand father) then and in that case it is my desire that my son Daniel and daughter Rachel draw each of them One hundred dollars of the money arising from the sale of my Estate.

Lastly - I constitute, nominate and appoint Patrick Dagger, P.
Alexander Pope and Abner Field my Executors. And it is my will
and desire that they sell my land and negro man Stephen and
