of the former Town of Louisville Kentucky and be me pur-
chased of Sam^l Baxter and Margaret his wife being two thirds
of said lot as will appear by reference to the records of the
Clerk of Jefferson County to my father and mother John Chris-
tian Snell and Frederica Snell living in Germany in Europe
and at their death to descend unto my brothers and sisters
equally also living in Germany

2nd I devise and bequeath all my money now on deposit
in the Office of Discount and Deposit of the Bank of the
United States at Louisville and all money due me to note
account or otherwise to my said father and mother and at
their death to my said brothers and sisters in equal propor-
tions. And now having disposed of my little earthly property
it is my will and desire and I hereby appoint my friends
Christopher Long and Emanuel Seibert my Executors. As
Witness my hand this eleventh day of March one thou-
sand eight hundred and thirty (1830)
