

In the name of God Amen I David Phillips of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory do make, constitute and appoint this to be my last will and testament in manner and form as followeth. To wit: My desire is that my worldly business may be settled and adjusted by my wife Mary Phillips whom I appoint to be my Executrix. And after the settlement and adjustment aforesaid shall have been made and my debts and all paid, I give and bequeath to my wife aforesaid all the residue of my property &c. &c. One negro man named James, One negro woman named Phillis and her two children, Two horses, with all the property I am entitled to out of the late Harriet Darnsley's estate by my intermarriage with the aforesaid Mary Phillips, also all my part of the crops now growing on the plantation of the late Harriet Darnsley to be divided by persons to be chosen by my Executrix and her mother Mrs Sarah Darnsley. The before named property I give to my beloved wife Mary Phillips to her and her heirs forever, in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 29th day of July 1833

At a County Court held for Jefferson
County in the State of Kentucky at the Court house in the City of
Louisville on the Second day of September Anno Domini eight hun-
dred and thirty three

The within instrument of writing was pro-
duced in Court and proved by the oaths of John Hughes and
Ebenzer Williams witnesses thereto and therefore the same
was established by the said Court to be the last will and
testament of Robert Phillips deceased late of said County
and ordered to be recorded and is recorded.

And on the motion
of Mary Phillips (widow of said Robert Phillips) who made
oath according to law the being named Executrix in said
will execution of the same was granted her & hereupon she
gave bond with Robert P. Stewart her Security in the penalty of
Six thousand dollars conditioned according to law.
