At a County Court held for Jefferson County
at the Court house in the City of Louisville on the Seventh day of
January One thousand Eight hundred and thirty three. On this day
David Ray proved by John A. Lake and Edward Mc Smith to the
satisfaction of This Court that Patrick Ray died in New Orleans
on the 24th day of October 1832 and that said Patrick Ray before
his death and within six months last past made a nuncupative
will, in and by which he devised his whole estate to his brother
the said David Ray and that the said Patrick was of sound mind
and memory when he made said will. That he was a Pilot on a
Steam boat engaged in the Coasting trade and was taken sick
and died away from home. And that he called upon said Lake to
bear witness that such was his will in presence of Summers.
And said David Ray further proved that said Patrick on two other
occasions within six months past when in good health declared
that it was his will that his brother David Ray should have his
whole estate and that said Patrick was over twenty five years of
age. Whereupon it is ordered that said Nuncupative will of
Patrick Ray shall be and the same is hereby established
which will is that the said David Ray the brother shall have
the whole estate of said Patrick Ray decd. which will is order-
ed to be recorded and is recorded
