First, I do give to my son Robert Johnston and my son
General ~~Johnston~~ a negro Man named Isaac, that he
may be hired and the money put to the use of the two, that is
Robert & General Secondly I give to Nancy Chew Johnston my
Daughter, a negro Woman named Jeff and her two young
children called Anne and Eliza - Thirdly I do give
and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy One Feather Bed and
also one half Bible and one set miller's

Mother. All my wearing apparel I do give my Daughter
The other Feather Bed and furniture and all my Monied
Property is to be sold, except the cows, and the money to be divided
between my three youngest Children - I do give the Cows to
my sons Robert and General - I do give and bequeath one Team
Horse to General and Nancy it is my wish that he is sold and
the money divided between the two - And all that may be coming
to me as my personal Estate is to be divided between my son
Robert, General and Nancy - I do Will and appoint John
Harrison and Michael Lacasagne Executors to this my last
Will and Testament - It is my Will and desire that Nancy
will live with my Daughter Polly Harrison that John
Harrison will take particular care of her Education and
the manner she is now accustomed in the paths of Vir-
-tue while she is young and she will not depart from it -
Let the hire of the Woman Bells go to support Nancy - Signed
