who took the oath required by law and gave bond with John A.
Honore and John P. McCasland Security in the penalty of five
thousand dollars conditioned according to law, And leave was
given Worden Pope the other Executor therein named to join in the
Execution of the said Will thereafter

but of perfect memory and mind and being in the 63rd year
of my age, and calling to mind that it is appointed
for me to die and when they know not, I do make
this my last Will and Testament, in manner
following, I give to my daughter Nancy

man named Sam and one girl named Polly and all their future increase
to her the said Nancy Duncan and her heirs forever.

Secondly - I give to my daughter Sally G. Howell one negro man named
Bob, one negro woman named Dena, one negro lad named Barnette, one
negro girl named Amanda to her the said Sally G. Howell and her heirs
forever, together with all their future increase.

Third - I give to my daughter Betsey Ship one negro man named Harry, one negro
woman named Abby, one negro woman named Gillis, one negro boy named
John and one negro boy named George, one feather bed and furniture, one
bureau, one brown mare and one saddle and bridle and all their future
increase to her the said Betsey Ship and her heirs forever.

Fourth - I give to my daughter Lucy Ship one negro woman named Nancy
and her child Wining, one negro woman named Abner, one negro girl
named Rose, one negro man named Daniel and one negro boy named
Washington, one grey mare, one saddle and bridle, one feather bed and
furniture, one bureau and all their future increase to her the said
Lucy Ship and her heirs forever.

Fifth - I give to my son Thomas Ship one negro man named Tegen and
one negro man named Sam, I also give to him my son Thomas Ship
all the money which I paid for him to Messrs James Taylor and others to
the amount of nearly four thousand dollars, I likewise give him one
sleigh and book case to him the said Thomas Ship and his heirs forever.

Sixth - I give to my son Edmund Ship one mulatto man slave named
Lewis and four hundred dollars in cash which I lent him, and
which negro and cash I suppose he now has in his possession, I also give
him one Secretary and book case to him and his heirs forever.

Seventh I give to my Son Ewell Shipp all that part of my land beginning at James Sneeds most southerly corner at two beeches marked I, S, thence with Stansburys and my line to where we corner together between two meadows, thence from that corner to where my land cornered with James Sneeds land on the East side of the pond to a beech and a pine and near the edge of the pond, thence a straight line with James Sneeds and myself to the beginning, supposed to contain about eighty acres be the same more or less, I also give to my Son Ewell Shipp one negro man named Charles, one boy named Orange, one negro woman named Sharlotty and one girl named Cassandana, also one boy named Cole one year old, together with all their future increase to him the said Ewell Shipp and his heirs forever.

Eighth I give to my Grand daughter Minerva L. Lampton one negro girl named Pety together with her future increase to her and her heirs forever.

Ninth I give to my Grand daughter Fanny M. Lampton one negro girl named Mariak together with all her future increase to her and her heirs forever.

Tenth I give to Grand Son Edmond S. Lampton one negro boy named Flungo to him and his heirs forever.

Eleventh I lend to my wife Sabina Shipp so long as she may live or continue my widow all the remaining part of my land which I now live upon and which I have not devised to my Son Ewell Shipp supposed to contain one hundred and fifty acres.

Tenth - I give to Grand son Edmond L Lampton and negro boy
named Alonzo to him and his heirs forever.

Eleventh - I lend to my wife Sabina Shipp so long as she may live
or continue my widow all the remaining part of my land
I now live upon and which I have not devised to my son
Shipp, supposed to contain one hundred and fifty acres
the same more or less, containing all my house and
plantation and after her death or her death
I give all my land and plantation to my son
Euell Shipp and his heirs forever.

Twelfth - I give to my wife Tabitha Shipp after all my just debts are paid all the remaining part of my estate in fee, for her to give or dispose as she may think proper, Consisting of the three following Slaves, Titus, Baccus and Gemmy, and all my stock of horses, cattle, sheep and hogs, household and kitchen furniture of every description which is not before given away to my children, all my crop on hand and the farming utensils as well as all the money I have in the house, as well as all money due to me on bond, note or account for her own use and benefit to her and her heirs forever.

Lastly - It is my desire that if either of the following of my children, viz - Betsy, Thomas, Edmond, Lucy or Euell should die without leaving an heir or without a will, It is my desire in that case that the surviving children of these last named five children shall only be entitled to any part of the estate that either of them may be entitled to or own at the decease of the one that may so die.

And I do appoint my wife Tabitha Shipp my Executrix and Daniel S Howell and Edmond Shipp my Executors of this my last will and testament.
