Brown, James W. Sanders, Polly Quetermious (widow of James Quetermious
deceased) and Thomas W. Wilson my grand son. I also leave
the residue of my estate, arrears of hire and all property of whatsoever
description to be sold on a credit of twelve months and the proceeds of
the same after paying my burial expences and just debts to be equally
divided between my beloved children as aforesaid. That is to say
my son Elisha Quetermious, Nancy Brown, Polly Quetermious widow
of James Quetermious deceased, James W. Sanders and my grand
son Thomas W. Wilson. I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Elisha
Quetermious my executor of this my last will and testament, moreover
I do hereby utterly revoke and disallow all former bequests by me
in any wise made, declaring this to be my last will and testament.
