that he pay all debts due by the late firm of Peter W. Hayson & Co.
also pay my dear Mother two hundred dollars annually during
her life for their separate use.

As to the residue of my estate after the pay-
ment of debts I devise the annual interest and proceeds to my dear
wife Sally One half and the other half to James D. Brackinridge
trust for the separate use of my Mother Caroline W. Hayson during
the respective lives of the said Sally and Caroline and upon their
deaths the said residue to be divided among my nephews and nieces
then living, that are now or may be before that time be born.

I appoint the said Brackinridge Executor of this
will. Witness my hand and seal this 3rd day of May 1837.
For consideration that the said Brackinridge shall take upon
himself the Execution of this will I devise to Peter W. Hayson
trust for the separate use of my Sister Eliza M. Brackinridge
half of what I may be entitled to or shall recover under a Con-
tract and Conveyance from Wm Beard and wife for their inter-
est in the estate of Arthur L. Campbell deceased, after paying
or releasing to said Beard the portion he is entitled to of the
land near Louisville unsold according to contract with me.
