and State of Virginia ^{Jefferson County, VA 1783-1813} ^{www.kentuckypioneers.com} being to mind
the uncertainty of the times as well as the ^{death} ^{and}
being at perfect health and memory thought fit to settle my concerns
while it pleases god to afford me opportunity and ability. I do
therefore constitute this my last will and testament (as concerning what
effects I have in this Country) and first I will my soul to god
who gave it my body to the church from whence it was taken and as
concerning my temporary substance that god has been pleased to bless me
with I do dispose of in the following manner vizt I do give and bequeath
unto my eldest son William Hallway all my body land except my the
bequest; I do also give and bequeath unto my son James Hallway
a note on David & Joseph Hallway for Twenty pounds, my former
expenses to be paid out of said note by James Hallway (permanently)
as also my large Book Vez Berke on the New
Testament the said Book to remain in the hands of James & Co

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Benjamin and George Pumroy for one year after my deceased father
as they live on this side of the Ohio; I also give and bequeath unto
my son John Hallway my best Hat together with my Land Warrant
for 500 Acres; I also give to my daughter Martha Sinkins
Wife to Laurence Sinkins all my Hoes and Hoe Kinds together with
my Horse Saddle; but provided Rutha comes to this country I also
will her to my said daughter Martha until she be eighteen years
old yet at her arrival might have a cow and half a milk calf
provided she comes this spring otherwise give to my said daughter Mar-
tha a blue spotted or a blue striped Rug that is now in the possession
of my son Joseph Hallway; I also give and bequeath unto my
daughter Margaret Pumroy wife to George Pumroy a pair of white

annul my former Will made in Pennsylvania signed sealed and Attested
