

I George Markwell Gent of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being old and infirm in body, but sound as to mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed unto men to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament. I give and bequeath to my son Elias Markwell all the tract or parcel of land that he is now living on, lying and being on the water of Goose Run in Spencer County with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging, to be fully and freely enjoyed by him and his heirs forever. And my will is that Elias Markwell shall at my death receive as his share my Grand son Alfred and shall at his death make him an equal with his other children in the above named property; but should the above named Alfred not behave himself as a dutiful son or should my son Elias dispose of the above named property, then my will is that Alfred shall receive of the above named property fifty dollars. I also give to my son Elias One Cow and a calf together with their increase, with this condition; that he shall when my Grand son Alfred comes of age or marries, give to him a new land Calf of equal value and also a new bed weighing 39 lbs, with some covering which he has now in possession. And it is also my will that five years from my decease, my son Elias shall pay unto my son John Markwell forty five dollars, with interest the last - if not sooner paid.

And I give and bequeath unto my son John Markwell a certain tract or parcel of land being a part of the tract of land

I give and bequeath to my son John Marshall a certain tract or parcel of land, being a part of the tract I now live on and bounded as follows Viz. Beginning at Pishy's now Morris line West corner and running thence Westwardly with the heels of my dyed on that line to a hollow known by the name of the Milldam hollow, thence down said hollow to the creek, thence up said creek measuring the same to Pishy's now Morris line and with said line Southwardly to the Beginning. And if there should not be forty acres in the same, then to cross the Milldam hollow and extend down the creek so as to make up forty acres.

I give and bequeath to my Grand children, the heirs of William Marshall deceased a certain parcel of land, being part of the above named tract and bounded as follows Viz. Beginning at the mouth of a hollow leading from the Spring where William Marshall formerly lived, thence up said hollow to a corner about one rod from the upper corner of Geo Marshall's field, thence Westwardly. Coursed with a blazed line to a dogwood and sugar tree on a Ridge, thence with a blazed line to a Hickory stump about one rod from the corner of Geo Marshall's new field, thence Westwardly with a blazed line to a stake, thence Northwardly with a blazed line to a Locust stump on the road, thence with said Road Westwardly to a Beech tree, thence Northwardly to it intersects a path or road that leads to Eliza Sparks at a White Oak and Poplar, thence with said Road to line of the above named tract and then to follow the lines of the above named tract so as to embrace all the land of the above named tract East of the above named line.

Southwardly to the Boggy Run and with said line
acres in the same, then to cross the Milldam hollow and extend
down the Creek so as to make up forty acres.
I give and bequeath to my Grand children, the heirs of William
Markwell deceased a certain parcel of land, being part of the
above named Tract and bounded as follows Viz. Beginning at

one rod from the upper corner of Geo. Markwell's field, thence

about one rod from the corner of Geo. Markwell's new field, thence
Westwardly with a blazed line to a stake, thence Northwardly
with a blazed line to a Locust stump on the road, thence with
said Road Westwardly to a Beech tree, thence Northwardly to
it intersects a path or road that leads to Eliza Sparks at a
White Oak and Poplar, thence with said Road to line of the
above named tract and then to follow the lines of the above
named tract so as to embrace all the land of the above named
tract East of the above named Division line. And it is also my
will that the heirs of William Markwell deceased five years
after my death shall pay to my son John Markwell forty five dollars
with interest, the two last if not sooner paid.
I give and bequeath unto my son George Markwell a the

remaining part of the above named tract or parcel of land
and also that part of the tract of land which I now own which
I purchased of Taylor, lying South west of the tract I now live on.
And it is also my will that my son George shall within four
years pay unto my son John One hundred dollars, with interest
the two last if not sooner paid.

I also give to my daughter Elizabeth
Smith the following articles in addition in addition to what
she has already received, One cupboard and its furniture and
my chair, two sheets, two kettles, two pots, an Oven, a skillet, glass
and all my pewter, her mother's saddle and a big and little wheel.
Now will is that all my property not her in otherwise disposed
of shall be equally divided between all my children.
