In the name of God Amen, I George Whips late of the State of Maryland now of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky, being in a bad state of health, but of sound mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, I give and bequeath my Eldest son John all my estate real, personal and mixed also all moneys due to me either on bonds, notes, mortgages or accounts on the following conditions to-wit:

1st That he pay all my just debts which amounts to a considerable sum.

2^d That he is to use his best endeavors to keep the property and family together during the life time of my dearly beloved wife Susan Whips.

3rd That within twelve months after he shall have paid off the debts due from me to others (for which a reasonable time shall be allowed) he is to pay to my son Robin One hundred and Sixty six dollars & 66 $\frac{2}{3}$ cents in gold or Silver.

4th That within twelve months after the payment so to be made to my son Robin as aforesaid, he is to pay to my son George One hundred and Eighty Six dollars & Sixty six cents money as aforesaid.

5th That within twelve months after the payment so to be made to my son George as aforesaid, he is to pay to my son Denton the sum

One hundred and sixty six dollars and two thirds cents
7. That within twelve months after the payments to be made to Denton as
aforesaid, he is to pay to my eldest daughter Susan, the sum of two hundred
and fifty dollars money as aforesaid.
8. That within twelve months after the payment to be made to my daughter
Susan, he is to pay to my daughter Rebecca two hundred & fifty dollars
money as aforesaid.
9. That within twelve months after the payment to Rebecca he pays to my son
Wesley the sum of One hundred and sixty six dollars sixty six & two thirds
cents money as aforesaid.
10. That he pays to each of my remaining three children Betsy, Joshua and
Samuel the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars money as aforesaid to
be paid at the rate of two hundred and fifty dollars per annum, to
commence in twelve months after the payment to my son Wesley and
the first of the three payments is to be made to my daughter Betsy, the
next to Joshua and the last to Samuel money as aforesaid.
11. That he affords to his mother in law (my percent faithful and affectionate
wife Susanna) a decent and comfortable support during her
life and that he raises my two youngest sons Joshua and Samuel and
educate them as well as I have my other children in general.
And I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my eldest son
John Whips my sole executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby
