

In the name of God Amen

I Henry Frederick Halbur of the County

of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory
and in good health, but calling to mind the uncertainty of human
life and being desirous of disposing of my worldly estate do hereby
make my last will and testament as follows that is to say:

First. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Fields of Illinois
one negro girl named Din whom she took into possession at the time of
her marriage. I give to my Grand children the infant heirs of my deceased
daughter Lucinda Hite one negro girl named Nancy.

To my daughter Margaret Ann McWalters I give the negro girl named
Vina. And to my daughter I give the negro girl named Sarah.

Secondly, I give the balance of my slaves to all of my heirs (the
infant children of my deceased daughter Lucinda to represent
her) to be divided in such a way as taking into consideration those
I have given to my daughters, that each one shall have an equal
share of them.

3rd I desire that all my household and kitchen furniture, my
stock of horses, cattle, sheep and hogs, my farming utensils
be sold by my Executors and that the money after the payment
of all my just debts, funeral expenses be divided among my
heirs as directed in the next preceding clause.

4^{thly}. It is my will that my wife shall have two rooms in my
house to wit: my bed room and the shed room to be occupied
and enjoyed by her for her life and that she be supported out
of the proceeds of my farm to be worked as hereinafter provided.

by my son James.
I desire that my son James shall after my death take possession of the Saw Yard and work the same rent free for the space of five years, if the place in which I now live should remain so long unsold. I also desire my said son James to remain on the plantation and work it to the best advantage and to support my wife out of the proceeds of my said son James and my daughter Mary Ann are to have the balance of the house (excepting the room allotted wife) until the place shall be sold as hereafter directed.

It is my will that upon the death of my wife or sooner if she will consent and relinquish her right upon being paid what my Executors shall think right, the plantation shall be sold by me to the best advantage and that the proceeds thereof be equally divided among all my heirs, considering the infant children of my daughter Lucinda Wito as one of them and the children of any of my other children who may die before the division also as representing the one who shall be deceased.

In the division of the estate I wish it to be understood that I have advanced to my son Simon A Halfus two hundred and forty two dollars 56 cents to my son Henry three hundred and eighty five dollars 90 cents to my son James one hundred dollars and to my daughters each one hundred dollars, which I require to be deducted from their respective shares and accounted for in the distribution and lastly I appoint my beloved sons James and Jacob Halfus Executors of this my last will and testament.

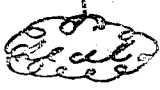
