1. After all my just debts and paid I give unto my son John Harden One hundred acres land which the said John Harden formerly lived on and for which I have given him a deed valued to three hundred dollars.

2. I give unto my son Henry Harden fifty acres land which he now lives on valued to three hundred dollars.

3. It is furthermore my wish that my wife Polly Harden should keep the place I now live on and enough of my personal estate to support her genteely. Also my stock of every description and the balance of my negroes I wish hired out until they pay the amount of three hundred and fifty dollars for each of my other children to receive it as they marry or become of age until they receive the whole amount. (Namely) Nancy, Polly, William, Allen, Eliza, Rebecca and Amanda all to have three hundred and fifty dollars to make them equal with the two eldest sons John and Henry.

4. It is also my wish that if my wife should die before all or any of them should get their possession, it is my wish my property should be so divided as to make the above named seven of my children who has not received any of my estate equal to my two eldest sons John and Henry and then should there be any left equal

It is also my wish that if my wife should die before all or any of them should get their possession, it is my wish my property should be so divided as to make the above named seven of my children who has not received any of my estate equal to my two eldest sons John and Henry and then should there be any left equally divided between the whole of my above named children.

5. It is also my wish that my wife as long as she lives should take the money arising from any part of my estate and pay it over to the maker or receiver it to those that it first becomes due to by not injuring herself.
