do this twentieth day of October One thousand Seven hundred and
Eighty six, Declare this to be my last will and Testament in manner
and Form following: I Recommend my soul unto Almighty God
who gave it, and my Body I Commit to the Earth to be decently
Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned
for the settling of my temporal Estate and such Goods and
Chattels and Debts as it has been please God to bestow upon me
In order and dispose of the same in the manner following
In premis I bequeath unto my beloved wife, Rebekah
Harding the whole of my Estate during her widowhood when
I also constitute and appoint my true and lawful Executors
of this my last will, with my much Respected friends Moses
Rykmade and Jonathan Nixon to execute this my will
According to the true intention thereof to best of their skill
To wit Seventy pounds of this my present Estate is to be paid
to my son Henry Harding at its Value, at appraisement also
also to my Daughter Caty Harding Seventy pounds to
be paid in the same manner, and at the decease of my
wife Rebekah Harding the whole of my Estate to be
Equally divided between my Five Children; John
Welmoth, Sarah Henry Caty, only one negro Gal named
Pot Excepted, and I do hereby direct and appoint that
after the death of my wife Rebekah she shall be free
from any claim of Slavery to any of my Successors
Hers or Successors for ever - and to the true testimony
of this being my last will and Testament, I do hereunto
set my hand and seal this day and date
