I Henry Garing of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky, being sick and weak in body, but of a sound mind and disposing memory, for which I thank God, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in like manner following, that is to say. I give, will and desire that the said sixty acres of land that I am now agreeable to a bond I now hold dated the 14th day of March 1812 from my father Philip Garing and also my Mother Catherine Garing, it being the part of my father's land that his former dwelling house is on. It is understood by myself that my Mother Catherine Garing is to hold the said sixty acres of land her life time and after my said Mother's death. I will and desire that the said sixty acres of land shall be sold to the best advantage. And after the said land is sold above mentioned, I will and desire that three hundred and fifty dollars shall be put in the possession of my sister Catherine Garing. And I also will and desire that one hundred and dollars shall be put in the possession of my said brother Jacob Garing, and the balance of the money that is left, I will and desire it to be equally divided among my three brothers, that is to wit, John, Philip and Benjamin Garing. And the balance of my estate, whatever it may be, I will and desire it to be equally divided among my four brothers to wit John, Philip, Benjamin and Jacob Garing.
