mind and senses do make this my last will and testament, To wit:
Item 1st I give to my son Daniel P Puryear twenty shares in the Louisville
Marine Insurance Company also one negro boy by name of Winston to have
and to hold forever.
2nd I consider the negro boy by name of Lem now hired to C Whittingham,
belonging to Joseph P Puryear
3rd Peggy and her children Mary, Milly, William, Decian and Rhody,
being left to her by her Grand father John Guarrant of the County of
Greenland and State of Virginia also the place on which I now reside
with every thing on it as belonging to my wife Edocia Puryear.
4th The balance of my negroes I consider belonging to my two Grand
daughters, daughter of Daniel P Pleasants named Mary Jane Pleasants
and Susan Ann Pleasants now living in Bowling Green with their fa-
ther Daniel P Pleasants having sold several of their black people and
bought others in their place, also thirty five shares in the Louisville
Marine Insurance Company, having sold two black boys for that
amount to wit: Charles and Richard. I owe some small debts which
is to be paid out of any money I may have.
I leave Joseph P Puryear my Executor and my request is that the
Court will not require any security from him
