I give and bequeath to my Lucy Dine during her natural life the
residue and balance of my estate. At the death of my wife Lucy it is my
will that the slaves or negroes and their increase belonging to my es-
tate and not before bequeathed shall be equally divided between my
said son William, my daughter Margaret and my Grand son John Burks
or between the survivors or to the survivors of them. The balance of my estate
at the death of my wife Lucy to be divided between my son William
R Dine and my daughter Margaret to Dine. At the death of my wife
Lucy it is my will that my negro woman Milly shall be main-
tained by my heirs and representatives and if she should not at the
death of my wife Lucy or at any time thereafter be capable or able
to support herself my said heirs William R Dine, Margaret to Dine
and my Grand son John Burks shall in equal proportions give
said woman Milly a sufficient and comfortable support.
If my wife Lucy Dine should depart this life before my Grand son
John Burks should arrive at the age of twenty one years, It is my
will that the slaves and all other property that may fall to his
share shall be hired out by my son William R Dine until he my
Grand son John Burks shall arrive to the age of twenty one years,
At which time my son William R Dine his heirs, Executors or
Administrators shall pay over to my said Grand son John Burks
the proceeds of such hire, interest and income that may accrue
thereon; but if my Grand son John Burks or my son William R
or my daughter Margaret to Dine shall die before the said John Burks

and proceeds of such here, that may accrue thereon; but if my Grand son John Burks or my son William B or my daughter Margaret & Fine should die before they marry without heirs of their body, the slaves left to my wife Lucy Fine, except woman Milly shall be equally divided between the survivors or to the one that shall be the longest lived.

If there should be any money or cash after paying my just debts and funeral expenses on hand at my death, It is my will that my Grand son John Burks shall have one third of sum or amt

It is my will that my wife Lucy Fine and William B Fine should be my Executors and Executrix, and that the Court will not require security of them. Witness my hand and the 2nd Sept 1831. Witness
