defense of our Country; and for fear of an accident do make
my last Will and Testament knowing it is Ordained for Persons
once to die - First I give Soul to Almighty and my Body
to be Buried in a Christian Burial at the discretion of my Execu-
tors. Secondly I give demise and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form - Also after my Debts being
paid Honestly the remains thereof I give and bequeath to
Thomas Reiley my beloved Friend to him and his Heirs forever
and I do hereby acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testa-
ment. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this
and Seal this ~~seventeenth~~ day of September in the year of our
Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety one

 1791 I John Gugg of the County of Jefferson Yeoman being
 very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and Mem^{ory}
 ry, thanks be unto God, therefore calling ^{un} to mind the Mortality
 of my Body, ~~and knowing that it is appointed for all men~~
 once to die. Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testa-
 ment: That is to say: Principally and first of all, I give and
 recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave
 it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent
 Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors. Nothing
 doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same
 again, by the Power of God. And as touching such worldly
 Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this
 life I demise and dispose of the same in the following manner
 of form — I demise I give and bequeath unto Ann my dear
 beloved Wife the Third part of all my moveable Estate except
 Farming Mantels likewise the House she now dwells in
 and her maintenance of the farm during her life
 Secondly I give five Shillings unto Margaret my Eldest
