I being the Father of the Family of the County of
Stew. and State of Kentucky being very weak and in a
state of health and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life
and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life being in a perfect
stare and on emergency do make and ordain this my last will and tes-
tament in manner and form following, which is to say:
I give and bequeath to my son Archibald McCauley and his
heirs forever, that part of my land lying South of the fence which
runs by the stock yard road to a live Sycamore tree on the
West side of the said fence, thence along the said fence to
line on the E. side, with this reserve that my son Arthur McCauley
shall have all the land that is now in cultivation in the
places known by the name of Trainers, together with the land
during the term of ten years.

I give and bequeath to my sons James McCauley, Daniel
McCawley and John McCauley the sum of one hundred
dollars to each of them current money of Kentucky.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Beverly
acres of land including the land whereon she now lives, together
with the land in the following boundary, running with the
division between Pendergast and myself to a small branch
by the name of the little Spring branch, thence down the said
branch to Haywood's road, thence to the house supposed to be
acres be the same more or less to her the said Ann Beverly and her
heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Arthur McCauley and his

hine forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Arthur (McCauley) and his heirs forever the balance of all my land and improvements upon it now live, and it is my desire that a house be built twenty feet long and eighteen feet wide of hewn logs with one stone chimney at the expense of Joshua and Arthur McCauley and said house shall be for the use of Ann Beverly and my daughter Margaret McCauley, together with five acres of land on or near the place where Daniel Rush now lives and a sufficiency of wood during their natural lives. And it is further my desire that Joshua and Arthur McCauley do furnish my daughter Margaret McCauley two hundred bushels of corn and three hundred pounds of flour annually during life.

Item. I give my stock of hogs to my son Arthur McCauley. My stock of cattle and sheep I give to my son Arthur McCauley. My property of Beverly and Margaret McCauley to be equally divided between them.

To this my last will and testament I do appoint my sons, Joshua McCauley, John McCauley and Arthur McCauley as Executors, revoking and disannulling all other wills by me made. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal (in presence of us) this 16th day of August 1865
