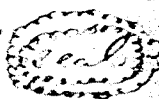

I give and bequeath unto my dear and beloved wife Mrs. Linda all my real and personal estate of what kind and nature soever without any provisional remark, except that if she can conveniently remit my beloved Sister Elizabeth M. Connell some presents in remembrance of me, My estate in negro property consists - Male Slaves to wit Caesar, Sam and Benson, female Sally. It is my preference in mind that my dear wife retain Caesar as long as she can as her attendant slave, as to my other property both real and personal it is not necessary to particularize as my rights and title will demonstrate their own validity as to each particular article and lastly I nominate and appoint my trusty Vicer in law Richard Newlin and my trusty friends William Pope and John Bustard or any two of them who are willing to take the burden of the execution of this my last will and testament, And by these presents I do revoke all other wills or writing on this subject dated previous to this date and declare this and only this to be my last will and testament.
