3rd I bequeath to my brother George William Dunstall my watch
4th I bequeath the residue of my property after my funeral expenses and just debts have been paid and the legacies before mentioned have been distributed, to my three sisters Maria S. Dunstall, Lucinda Dunstall, and Jane M. Dunstall to be equally divided between them—

5th I will that should my sister Maria S. Dunstall die not having been married, that portion of my estate which she may have inherited, be equally divided between my Sisters Lucinda Dunstall and Jane M. Dunstall—

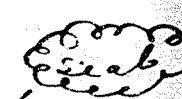
6th I direct that the part of a lot of ground, number 29, which I own it is situated in the town of Louisville
