

The State of our Country rendering life more precarious than usual induces me to make this my last and only will and testament.
I appoint my brother Saml Gilly my Executor to settle all my affairs.
I give to Saml Gilly son of Saml Gilly one thousand dollars to be invested by my Executor in some safe fund within twelve months after my decease for his use until he shall arrive at the age of eighteen years or be married when I wish him to have the Control thereof.
All the balance of the property that I may die possessed I wish to be divided equally between my brothers Robt L Pryor, Nathl Pryor and Robt McClelland and my Sisters Saml B Gilly and Eliza Oldham, each to receive One fifth which my Executor is requested to pay over within twelve months from my decease.

At a County Court held for Jefferson County in the State aforesaid at the Court house in Louisville on the 13th day of August 1822. The within instrument of writing was produced in Court and proved to be the hand writing and wholly written by the said James Pryor by the oaths of William McKee and Gray Davis and thereupon the same was established by the Court to be the last will and testament of the said James Pryor deceased and the same was ordered to be recorded and is recorded in my office this 14th of the said Court.
