

By the oath of William Tully one of the subscribing witnesses. It was also proved by the oaths of Thomas Edwards and Wm. Pope that Edward Ashby another of the subscribing witnesses is dead - that they have seen the said Ashby and a certain wife, and that they believe the signature of said Ashby and Osborn to said will is their hand writing. It was also proved that William Murray another of the subscribing witnesses to said will is dead, and his son William Murray that he believes the signature of the said William to said will is his hand writing. It was also proved by the oath of said Edwards that Thomas Freeman the other subscribing witness to said will is about eighty years of age and resides in the state of Virginia, but it is not known when he lives or whether he is yet alive or dead. Upon which proof it was ordered that this will be recorded. Test Wm. Pope etc.

In the name of god Amen, I James Duntmon of York pool County of Jefferson. Being weak in body but sound in memory considering the uncertainty of life do make and publish this my last will and testament in the manner and form following, that is to say first I leave and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth the three negroes named Easter Cealis & Adams with one third part of the land I now live on for her life time. Also all the rest of my personal ~~estate~~ property at my wifes death to be equally divided amongst the 4 Children and among the tract of land he lives on as it was laid off by John Q. Moore. Also to my Daughter Nancy that part of the tract that she and the Doctor lives on.

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As was laid off by John G. Moore I leave to my son James
two thirds of the land I now live on after my death
and the remaining third after my wife's death to him
also to my Daughter Rhodia James and grand son
Thomas Nelson my lands on Cullskin to be equally
divided ^{between} ~~among~~ them if obtained and if not obtained
to have twenty pounds worth of property each of them
out of the personal property as above given to my wife
Elizabeth my wife Elizabeth is to do or dispose of at her
death with the three negroes as she pleases I have hereby
appointed my son Eliza and James my sons to be my
sole Executors of this my last will and testament to make
by me this 28th day of April 1803 James Quartermoun

in Louisville on the 13th day of March 1809 the within Inst-
rument of writing purporting to be the last will and tes-
tament of James Quartermoun deceased was produced

Leavin Cooper two of the subscribing witnesses thereto
and ordered to be recorded
