

eightth part of the money now left them as they become of lawful age with any or all interest that may be in the hands of the Executors upon such Eighths.

5^{thly} At the death of my wife I wish the negroes to be sold, provided the children are all of age; if not, I wish the Executors to hire out the negroes for the support and Education of such as may be under age.

Lastly I appoint John and Samuel Flowers of Breckinridge County Executors to this my last will and testament, having Confidence in their honesty and integrity and believing that they will follow this my last will in every point.
