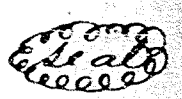
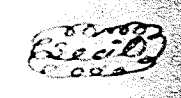


In the name of God Amen I John Bradshaw being of sound memory do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following and in as much as there are certain dues and demands both for and against me, I have annexed a schedule of both as nearly as I can recollect. And first after the payment of all legal demands against me, I give and bequeath unto my most esteemed friend Thomas Hoyle Major in the Service of the United States all the notes and bonds in my black leather pocket book amounting to Seven hundred and fifty dollars and upwards. Also the residue or remainder of a tract in sold on the little Miami (it being the only tract of land I claim, it requires no explanation) also two hundred and fifty acres claimed by me in virtue of William Perry's obligation in the United States donation lands, one house and lot at the Rapids of Ohio. And it is my desire that the said Thomas Hoyle should have and enjoy the bequests aforesaid, reserving and ordering that ten guineas be expended in the purchase of a ring or some other fashionable toy to be presented to my most worthy friend Doct^r Allison for his lady. And further that a like sum of ten guineas be expended in the purchase of a ring or some other fashionable toy to be presented to Mr. Dickinson Esquire for the use of his lady. And further it is my desire that all my personal estate not already mentioned be sold by public vendue to discharge such debts as I may have contracted in this Country and all the estate I left at Mr. Gregg's in the Town of Pittsburgh be also sold at public vendue and that the proceeds of Sixteen discharges purchased from Lewis after St. Clair's defeat also be appropriated to the discharge of my debts and the residue

or overplus arising from all the aforesaid sales together with the residue
of my estate, both real and personal, all my book accounts and claims
of what nature soever they be, I give and bequeath to the aforesaid
Thomas Doyle & Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal, declaring this Will to be bona fide mine and protesting against
any informality that may appear for want of precedent or form and
dated this twenty first day of February in the year of our Lord
One thousand Seven hundred and ninety four

of the said John Bradshaw and at his request. And that you shall certify
the attestation of the said John Whistler so taken in the manner such
acts are usually authenticated by you and send the same without delay
together with the said will and this Commission to the Clerk of the
County Court of Jefferson County in the said State at the Court house in
