Imprimis. Item. I give and bequeath to my said Wife Betsey my negro man Tom and all the property of which I was possessed at the time of our intermarriage and which I have since acquired (Except as shall be herein after excepted) including all Judgements, Executions, Bonds, Specialties, notes and accounts to her and her heirs forever. But it is my will and desire and I do hereby order and direct that my said Wife Betsey shall pay my just debts out of the estate hereby given to her.

Item. I give and bequeath to Doct James C Johnston and his heirs forever my stock of medicine, Shop furniture and library. I also give and devise to him and his heirs and assigns all my interest in the Mills on Pond Creek Jefferson County, Ky. and he shall rebuild the Dam and put the whole into operation as contemplated by him and myself. But if he shall decline the further improvement shall be declined and the property then I give and bequeath my interest and part of the same

Item. In case my father Lemuel Collins be now dead or
shall die before me and I shall be entitled to any Estate
real or personal or both from him by devise or descent, I give and
devise the same to my brother Daniel and Sister Esther to
be equally divided between them and in case either shall die
without issue or without disposing of his or her moiety. It is
my will and desire that the whole shall go to the survivor
and in case either be now dead without issue, the whole
shall go to the survivor.

Lastly. I appoint the said Daniel C Johnston Executor of
this my last will and testament.
