In the name of God amen the Twenty fifth day of October
1791 I John Gregg of the County of Jefferson Yeoman being
very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and Memory
thanks be unto God. therefore calling ^{un}to mind the Mortality
of my Body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men
once to die. Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testa-
ment: That is to say: Principally and first of all, I give and
recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave
it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent
Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors. Nothing
doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same
again, by the Power of God. And as touching such worldly
Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this
life I demise and dispose of the same in the following manner
To wit — I demise I give and bequeath unto Ann my Dear
beloved Wife the Third part of all my moveable Estate excepting
Farming Utensils likewise the House she now dwells in
and the maintenance of the farm during her life
Secondly I give five Shillings unto Margaret my Eldest
Daughter to be raised out of my moveable Effects
Thirdly I give unto my Daughter Lydia five Shillings
to be raised out of my moveable Effects
Fourthly I give unto my son David all my moveable

my farming utensils with the one Third of my moveable
Effects. Likewise I constitute make and Ordain him
John Todd my whole Executors of this my last will and
most Fully I give unto my Daughter Mary the Third
of all my Moveable Effects. Likewise she is to live with her
Mother whilst she remains single and is to have her Main-
tenance out of my farm clear of any charges. In Witness
whereof I have set my hand and seal the day and year above
