

19. I John Harrison of Louisville, being of sound mind and
memory make this my last will and testament

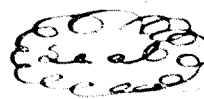
Item I bequeath to my wife Mary Ann all my negroes my household and kitchen furniture, together with all my horses and cows to her and to her heirs forever

Item Ist. I give and bequeath to my son John one fifth part of my estate in trust for my daughter Sophia Ann. And during her natural life. And at her death the same shall go and descend to her children then living and to the heirs of such as shall be dead, they receiving the part or portion which their parent would have been entitled to. And should my Executors herein after named think it will be more advantageous to my children to lease or sell all or any part of my estate herein and hereby bequeathed to them, they are hereby empowered to do so for the best price they can procure for the same in cash or on such credit as they shall think proper and the one fifth part thereof which my said daughter shall be entitled to shall be put out at interest and the interest arising therefrom paid to her as my said son shall think sufficient for the said Sophia and her childrens support and to the education of her said children. If however the interest arising from her said portions shall be insufficient, then such part of the principal shall be taken and used for the purposes aforesaid as my son shall deem sufficient leaving it entirely to his discretion in no event are the children of my said daughter to receive

to compromise every and all matters of dispute respecting my said estate by arbitration or otherwise as they (or such as shall act) may think proper.

If unhappily there should arise any difference or dispute between my said children respecting my estate herein devised to them it is my request and will that they leave it to the Arbitration of some respectable men. Having thus finished my last will and testament I in testimony of which hereto set my hand and seal on this 19th

of June in the year A D 1821
