born to die do make and establish this my last will and testament
in manner and form following (that is to say). First I will that my
body be decently buried and funeral expenses and all debts which
I shall justly owe at the time of my decease be paid in the first
instance out of my estate. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Agnes the plantation on which I live on exclusive of that
part I do denominate for my son Andrew which she is to have
enduring her life if she sees fit to live on it, but if she should deter-
mine otherwise and break up housekeeping or depart this life it is
my will and desire that the plantation be sold and the proceeds
thereof be disposed of as hereafter by this will directed. I do also
give and bequeath to my said dear wife a negro woman named Polly
and a negro man named Dones for her support enduring her natural
life. I do also give and allow to my said wife my household and
furniture for her benefit and to dispose of as she may think proper
without any debt, and book case. I do also allow to my said wife

my stock of cattle, horses, sheep and hogs, after selling such a part as will be sufficient to pay the debts which I may owe at the time of my decease or otherwise directed by this will.

Item. It is my will and desire when the plantation is sold by my Executors or the Survivors or Survivors of them that the proceeds thereof be divided amongst my children as by this will directed. Item. Out of the proceeds of sale of said plantation when the money is collected, I give and allow to my daughter Mary McCaslan two hundred dollars. Also in like manner I give to my daughter Elizabeth Ross two hundred dollars, likewise to my daughter Agnes Hallor two hundred dollars. Also in like manner I give to my son John one hundred and fifty dollars, all which legacies are to be out of the proceeds of the plantation when sold and

the money collected. And it is further my will and desire that if the plantation cannot be sold for a sufficiency to satisfy the above named legacies, it is to be proportioned agreeable to their legacies or if it can be sold for more than a sufficiency it is to be proportioned in addition agreeable to their legacies. Item. I give and bequeath to my son Alexander one dollar which is all I allow him, as I have already provided for him. I give and bequeath to my son Nathan one dollar, as I have already provided for him. I give and bequeath to my daughter Rachel Mearns one dollar having already provided for her. Item. I give and bequeath to my son Allen a negro boy named Reubin which boy he is to have if he ever returns to receive him, or if he should die or not return the said boy Reubin to be sold and the proceeds to be equally divided amongst all my children. Item. I give and bequeath to my ~~son~~ daughter Sarah two negro girls one named Judy and the other named Julia

I give and bequeath to my ~~dearly~~ ^{beloved} daughter Julia
one named Judy and the other named Julia
also a cow which she has heretofore claimed with two others
of equal value, a bed and furniture which she has already claimed and
a new bureau. I am. I give and bequeath to my son Andrew one
hundred acres of land, part of the tract now live on, beginning
at the beech trees marked and shown to my son Alexander running
a straight line to a stone near a middle fence, thence running
North forty five degrees, East till it strikes Williams Edwards line
and with his line to Francis Snowdens Corner and with Snowdens
line till it strikes Snowdens Corner line and with Snowdens
line to the beginning on said beeches. I am. I give and bequeath to my
son in law Reubin Ross my desk and book case. I am. It is my will
and desire that the negro man named Jones, which by this will is
