In the name of God Amen I David Wood Minister of
the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being in low state of Health
at present but sound of mind and Memory do make Constitue and
omit, this to be my last will and testament, Revoking all others heretofore
made by me and as aforesaid of my estate in manner and form as follows
with (Viz)

Item, it is my will and desire that my Executors do pay all my Just
debts, and to enable them so to do it is my desire that the sell so much
of my estate as will be sufficient to accomplish the same.

Item It is my will and desire that my Executors do collect one bond
in my possession of one hundred and fifty pounds on Robert Nelson
which Bond will be due on the first day of May next, and likewise
make sale of one Bay mare and colt, also one other bay mare three
years old next Spring and the Money arising from the Sale of the
Mares and colt, Together with the Money to be collected on the Bond
above mentioned, to be laid out wholly in the purchase of a Tract of
Land as near my present dwelling place as they conveniently can
or else where that my wife Mary Memether may be buried
and the same purchased. I Give to my beloved wife Mary Memether
