thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, the undersigned
were at the house and residence of John Wheeler deceased in
Louisville in said County during his last illness and but a short
time before his death, that said Wheeler appeared to be of perfect
sound mind and memory and spoke to his friends in atten-
dances considerably on the subject of his situation and business
That on the said fourteenth day of December the said Wheeler sta-
ted in the presence of Lewis White one of the undersigned, that
it was his wish that his wife Christiana Wheeler should have
his property after his death or words to that effect. And that
afterwards on the 16th day of December the said John Wheeler
said in the presence and hearing of the undersigned Eliza
Applegate, in substance, that it was his wish that his wife
Christiana Wheeler should have his property after his death
and at the same time gave her advice as to the manner in
which she should manage it. The undersigned are both satis-
fied that it was the intention of the said John Wheeler that
his said wife should inherit his estate and that such was
his will from the nature of the expressions used by him.
