the property which my wife may think to give up, sell for more than will
give each of children except Aaron, One hundred dollars each, then
in that case it is my desire that Aaron Wilhoit shall come in for an
equal proportion of the balance at the death or intermarriage of my
well beloved Wife. It is my desire that my whole estate of Every nature
and property may be sold and the money equally divided among all
my children - Lastly, I appoint my well beloved Wife Executrix of
this my last Will and testament to which I have subscribed my
hand and Seal this 3rd day of November One thousand Eight Hun-
dred and fourteen
