

Applegate Joseph Applegate being now of sound mind and in feeble health
do make this my last will hereby revoking all other wills.

I devise in fee simple to my son Thomas the house and lot where
I now reside on Jefferson Street at the corner of Genl.

and I devise all the residue of my estate to my wife Mary and my
son Thomas as Trustees for the use of my family and I give them full
authority in their discretion to apply the rents and profits of this
portion of my estate to the support of my wife and my younger
children as they shall think proper and so long as my wife shall
live. And at the death of my wife it is my wish that all this por-
tion of my estate shall be equally divided among my children
giving Thomas an equal portion in addition to my house and lot.

And in selling apart this portion of my estate to my wife and
Thomas for the support of my family, I do not intend to give any
child a right to demand any part of the rents and profits,
but on the contrary I wish to leave the rents and profits to the
entire control and discretion of Thomas and my wife during her
life and that they shall apply them as they may think best.

I appoint Thomas Applegate and Mary Applegate Exors
and Executrix of this my will.

One thousand eight hundred and thirty three

An Instrument of writing
purporting to be the last will and testament of Joseph Applegato deceased
late of said County was produced in Court and proved by Garnett
Huncan, John H. Holbott and William C. Galt the subscribing witnesses
thereto and thereupon the same was established by the Court to be the
last will and testament of the said Applegato and ordered to be recor-
ded.

And on the motion of Mary Applegato and Thomas Applegato
Executrix and Executor named in said will the execution thereof was
granted to them who previously made oath according to law and
gave bond with Elisha Applegato their security in the penalty of six
thousand dollars payable to the Commonwealth of Kentucky and with
the condition thereto annexed required by law
