I Joseph Hunter of Jefferson County & State of Kentucky
 being weak in Body but in sound mind & Memory
 make & ordain this my last Will and Testament
 the words of form following

I do Will and bequeath to William Lewis and his
 heirs Severely Acres of Land to be laid off as follows
 part of the Tract on which I now live To begin at
 the corner of Will Goodwin's N^o East corner and at my
 West corner, being one and the same corner & to run
 North Goodwin's and Hunter's line till it reaches the
 line of the road on the South side of the road

55 Thence so far East that a line North and South
beginning will include the Quantity

I do Will and Devise to Asahel Linn his heirs
Twenty Acres of Land being a part of the Tract above men-
tioned, to be laid off in the following manner To begin
at my North East corner & to run West with a line of
the Survey till it strikes William Linn's N East corner
of his Seventy Acre Survey, thence South with S Linn's
line so far that a line East and North to the beginning
will include the Quantity

The residue of my part of the S. Tract being thirty Acres
I do Will and Devise to my son Joseph Munn & his heirs
his heirs forever

And whereas there will be included in either William
Linn's or Asahel Linn's survey a certain part of Miller
Creek supposed to be an eligible place for a Mill, Now
I do hereby Will and direct him, in whose survey S
Seat may be included to pay to the other the half of the

by each party respectively chosen & in case of their disagree-

Whereas I have in my Possession an order from Wm
Pope on Joseph Applegate for Twenty pounds being a
part of Fifty pounds due me by s^d Pope for Fifty Acres of
Land in Hunters Bottom in Addition to One hundred and
fifty Acres which formerly sold to said Pope, which Order I
here with what may be still due me by s^d Pope I do
bequeath to Joseph Hunter

I do hereby Authorise and direct Joseph Hunter as
one of my Executors to convey to William Pope or his Agent
Two Hundred Acres of Land in Hunters Bottom including
One Hundred fifty mentioned in a certain Article of
Agreement which exists between us & agreeably to s^d Article
of Agreement

And I do hereby Authorise and direct William

three (years & to divide the Money or property (as the case may be) arising from the Sale thereof equally among my heirs: But should they not dispose of it within said time then the Land itself shall be equally divided among my heirs or otherwise disposed of as they shall think proper. The heirs that I have alluded to I had in view are these to follow Viz Joseph Hunter, Joshua Archer, William Linn and Isaac Linn and Martha Dunn

Whereas I have in my Possession an order from William Pope on Joseph Applegate for Twenty pounds being a part of Fifty pounds due me by s^d Pope for Fifty Acres of Land in Hunters Bottom in Addition to One hundred and twenty Acres which formerly sold to said Pope, which Order I have therewith what may be still due me by s^d Pope I have and bequeath to Joseph Hunter

I do hereby Authorise and direct Joseph Hunter as one of my Executors to convey to William Pope or his Assigns Two Hundred Acres of Land in Hunters Bottom including One Hundred fifty mentioned in a certain Article of Agreement which exists between us & agreeably to s^d Article of Agreement

And I do hereby Authorise and direct William Pope as one of my Executors to convey to my several devisees the One Hundred and Fifty Acres which he has agreed to convey to me

Last Will and Testament

I do appoint William Pope and Joseph Hunter Executors
of this my last Will and Testament. Any other Will, Testame-
ment & other disposal of property notwithstanding
