said Wife shall be paid annually by my Executors or Administrators
out of the proceeds of my Estate real and personal the sum of two hun-
dred dollars. Item. My will and desire is that in case my land should
be sold by the consent and desire of all parties concerned, then and in
that case that my said Executors or Administrators hereafter to be named
shall provide out of the proceeds thereof a comfortable dwelling for my
Wife as long as she shall live, exclusive of the two hundred dollars
per annum and the negro before given. Item. My will and desire is that
my Executors or Administrators shall out of the first monies received
procure for my children as follows Eliza, Isaac, Abraham, Rebecca and
Sarah Kellar a large family bible each. Item. My will and desire is
that the residue of my Estate shall be equally divided between my
children to wit - Eliza Kellar, Isaac Kellar, Abraham Kellar, Rebecca
Kellar and Sarah Kellar. Also that my children to whom I have made
advancements shall account for such advancement on the division
as to make them all equal in the division of my Estate after my just
debts and funeral Expenses are paid. And lastly I appoint my
trusty and Confidential friends George Hudson and Richard Har-
bour my Executors of this my last will and testament.

The foregoing last will and testament of Joseph Kellar dec^d was produced in Court and proved by the oaths of the said John Little and Jonathan ministers of the subscribing witnesses thereto and the codicil thereto annexed was proved by the oaths of the said John Little and Bel Peager two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and the said Will and codicil was by said Court ordered to be recorded and is recorded in my office. Whereupon the said Court granted Execution of the said Will and Codicil to George Hikes Sen^r and Richard Barbour the Executors therein named who took the oath required by law and gave bond with security in the penalty of five thousand dollars according to law.
