the State of Virginia, now of the Town of Louisville in the  
State of Kentucky, being weak in body but of strong memory  
& disposing mind calling to recollection the uncertainty of this life  
do make & declare this my last will & Testament Viz  
I will & desire that after the payment of my just Debts the whole  
of my personal property and slave estate shall be kept together  
by my wife for the purpose of supporting herself my children  
and that such parts of my estate whether in this State or else  
where which she may think proper to dispose of shall be  
disposed of for land; And I will that the surplus property  
afo<sup>r</sup> shall be delivered up to the persons hereinafter named  
to be sold or exchanged for land as they or a majority of  
them may think best and in such part of this Country as  
shall appear most advantageous. I do hereby appoint  
the following named persons as trustees for the purposes  
aforesaid To wit Sarah Kennon, my beloved wife, Kennon  
Seaton, Wm H. Merrill, Alex. Fleming and John Rose who  
are vested (or a majority of them) with full power to  
purchase & procure land, with such property as  
may be necessary for the same.

Trustees (or a majority of them) with full power to  
convey two certain lots of land in the Town of Waver-  
burg - in the County of Green State of Penna. - and  
hereby nominate & constitute & appoint my wife

of my last will & Testament. In witness whereof
