condition they are willing to go to Liberia. And furthermore that
any of my said Executors place them at the disposal of the Coloni-
zation Society and furnish the means of paying their passage
to the Colony.

Item. I give my twenty acre lot in the City of Louisville to Lee Atty.

Item. I give my Transylvanian property to William Lee White.

Item. I give furthermore to the estate of William W White any monies due
me and any lands bought under my Executions against said estate.

Item. I will that all my personal property and lot in Natchez be
sold to pay my debts. I will my Goose Creek farm to Lawrence and
Elijah Young on condition that they hereafter pay to my Executors
twenty five thousand dollars in five annual instalments without
interest. I give to Jane McGlass and her children four thousand
dollars to be paid as my Executors get funds in hand.

I give to Catharine White's three children One thousand dollars each.

I give to Nancy Atty and her children three thousand dollars.

I give to Sarah H. Dunsay her children four thousand dollars.

I give to Ruth Vance five hundred dollars. I give to Elinora W.

Elston and George W White each one thousand dollars. I give to

I give to Elston and George W. White five hundred dollars each, I give to
William Lee and Elmer White one thousand dollars each, I give
to Charles Lee Butler one thousand dollars, I give to my mother two
thousand dollars, I give to Lewis Lee White five hundred dollars
I give unto Daniel White five hundred dollars.

Item. I give one thousand dollars for enclosing the graves and
erecting limbs over my father and Grand mother.

Item. Should my property amount to more than my special
legacies I wish the surplus divided pro rata among the legates
and should it fall short the deficit to be borne after the same
manner. It is further my wish that my Executors give to Miss
Marrieth Hobbs one thousand dollars to stand on same terms as
other legacies. I do constitute and appoint Leaven Lawrence,
Laurence Young and Robert H. Glass Executors of this my last
will and testament.

Item. I will five hundred dollars to be expended by en establish-
ing a Grave Yard on my farm, in which it is my wish to be
buried, and that such spot of land as me be choient be so
conveyed by deed from my legates Laurence and Eliza Young
as to make it a family burying ground for such of my relatives
as choose to use it.

Executorship thereof.
