This day was the Subscribers being called on by Leonard Hoke to make his will, he then informed us what it was. That his Executors should sell all his negroes for twelve months credit for the common currency of the State, the money arising from the sale should first go to pay all his just debts, the balance should be returned to the family for the use of the said family.

Also it was his wish that the family should live together until the youngest child come of age and then for them to have a division and for them to keep all the stock of every kind legal for the use of the family. And if the widow chooses to marry she must take her thirds. We undersigners do certify.
